







THE WAY WE WERE



From the Department of Law (1969) to the School of Law (1978) then to the Faculty of Law (1984) and to our celebrating in 2009 its 40 years of offering excellent standards of legal education in Hong Kong, let's retrace some of our footprints in the past four decades.

"The University's Legal Aid and Advice Scheme operated by the staff, postgraduate students and certain practitioners has begun. At the inspiration of the Honourable Mr. Justice T. L. Yang, a Legal Education Project with the aim of arousing the awareness of secondary school students to law and the legal system was also undertaken. Justitia and these two projects represent a consciousness of a duty to the community."

"Since the law has to cope with the changing needs of society, students of law should always adopt a sense of social awareness. It is with this view in mind that we set out to conduct the survey on the newly established Small Claims Tribunal."

"The findings [of the survey on the Small Claims Tribunal] will be of great significance both locally and externally in the continuing struggle to bring justice within the reach of everyone."


